Who or What is MoADSA?

The Missouri Adult Day Services Association is a 501 (c) 6 non-profit statewide association to support the development of adult day services as an alternative to institutional care. Governed by a 7-member Board of Directors, MoADSA is a membership-based association supported by dues and educational activities. MoADSA is a member of the National Adult Day Services Association.

What is the Mission of MoADSA?

To be dedicated to the growth and development of adult day services and to the service of its members.



Who can join MoADSA?

Provider Membership – adult day care providers licensed by the DHSS and/or the Department of Mental Health

Affiliate Membership - individuals or entities associated with the adult day services industry that support or provide services or products to adult day services.

Provisional Membership - adult day services providers that are in the process of becoming licensed.

MoADSA past successes

- **Senate Bill 567 - Adult Day Services Bill - Obtained a sponsor and worked with legislators to get this bill passed and signed into law in 2014. These changes:**
 - **Provide for annual training of providers across the State**
 - **Require the development of a state-wide ADC Manual**
 - **Include ADC providers in the informal dispute resolution hearing process, and**
 - **Requires a state-wide analysis of the true cost to provide ADC services within the state for the purpose of submitting a line-item in the budget for reimbursement**

- Ongoing solid relationships with State leaders who provide oversight to ADCs: Department of Health and Senior Services, Department of Social Services, Missouri Medicaid Audit and Compliance Unit, and the Department of Mental Health.
- Participated in DHSS meetings to –
 - draft necessary revisions to the ADC regulations (ongoing)
 - create the first state ADC provider manual, and
 - recommend revisions to the ADC Waiver Provider Manual

- Conduct membership meetings 3 times annually and offer an annual conference to provide education to address member issues, including:
 - Reassessments
 - Medicaid Waiver
 - Senate Bill 567
 - Dementia Care Mapping
 - Medicaid Reenrollment
 - ICD-10 Coding for ADCs
 - Special Needs Planning
 - Participant Choices & Change
 - Diabetic Prevention/Staff Training

Benefits of membership

- **Creates “one place, one source” for all you need to know to be a current and informed provider.**
- **State-wide strong network of providers that are collectively proactive with issues pertaining to audits and inspections, and looking for ways to improve consistency in the interpretation of regulations.**
- **Be an active part of the team working in partnership with various state agencies that govern ADCs.**
- **Receive training for new providers and on-going training for all providers.**

- Be kept informed of program changes and be a part of the process.
- Adult Day Care Directory - distributed to hospital social workers/discharge planners, legislatures etc.
- Day at the Capitol - talk with legislators about the importance of ADC's, how ADC's save the state money and the challenges providers face.
- Annual Conference - It's a great place to network, hear from state regulatory agencies, educate your staff and see presenters that will broaden your knowledge.
- Website – Members only section provides in-services, and up-to-date information affecting ADC providers.

Current hot topics.....

- **Adult Day Care regulations currently being rewritten to incorporate SB 567 changes and revise out-dated rules. (Waiting on DHSS to provide draft before publishing rules in the Missouri Register.)**
- **State expectations on how ADC providers are to comply with the new CMS HCBS regulations.**
 - **Invited to participate in DHSS stakeholders meetings to review the State's plan for implementation. (Waiting for dates to be set.)**
 - **Ongoing discussions with MMAC on implementation and expectations of providers under the new rules. Discussing the development of webinars in order to education ADC providers.**
